Young Marketeers Programme – additional information

Young Marketeers is a project run by School Food Matters that brings together children from local primary schools to experience the joy of growing, harvesting and cooking delicious fresh fruit and veg. Along the way they learn all about food surplus and, once the veg has been picked, engage their enterprise skills to sell their produce at the world-famous Borough Market.

All proceeds from the Young Marketeers sales will go to <u>The Felix Project</u>, London's largest food redistribution charity. The charity rescues good food that cannot be sold and delivers it directly to almost 1000 charities and schools serving people in need. **Every £1 raised will provide enough food for six tasty meals for vulnerable people across the capital.**

Young Marketeers Summer and Harvest Sales

Students take part in the following elements:

- Assembly (Tuesday 24th April 2023) an introduction to the programme and the concept of food surplus, delivered by our project partners The Felix Project.
- Gardening and market trader training at Borough Market (Wednesday 25th April 2023) the schools take a trip to the market to learn all about how to plant their seed from our expert gardener, and also how to set up the ultimate stall with help from the Borough Market team.
- Trip to The Felix Project depot to learn about food surplus first hand.
- **Gardening health check (June/July2023)** midway through the project the School Food Matters gardener visits every school to ensure that veg is in tip-top shape for sale day.
- Sale day (Wednesday 4th October 2023) schools head to Borough Market to become market traders for the day and sell their veg in aid of The Felix Project at either our Summer or Harvest Sale.
