

Cost-of-living support

Find out what support is available to help you and your family get through the cost-of-living crisis.

Let us know if you're in financial difficulty

We know that many families are going through a tough time and as a school we want to do everything we can to help you and your child. If you're struggling with your finances, please get in touch to let us know, as there may be things we can suggest which will help.

We have a Family Support Worker, Marta Tildesley, who can offer support with cost-of-living and any other family concerns you may have (such as housing, employment, parenting, immigration status or relationships). Contact Mrs Tildesley via the school office or look out for her at the school gates.

Contact your local Citizen's Advice Bureau or Family Hub

Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB)

You don't have to be a UK citizen to get support from your local CAB, you just need to be a resident of the local area. The CAB can help you with:

- > Getting benefits or organising other financial support
- Accessing support for essential costs (food, bills, rent)

Check you're paying the right amount of tax

Make sure you're on the right tax code. If you aren't, you might be due a refund. Use the <u>Money Saving Expert's</u> free tax code calculator to find out.

Claim any benefits you're entitled to

Use one of these benefits calculators to determine whether there are any benefits you could be claiming:

- >Turn2us
- > Policy in Practice
- > <u>Support for migrant families</u> use this calculator if you are a migrant family, or if you have no recourse to public funds (meaning you're not entitled to the majority of welfare benefits)

You may be able to get benefits paid early if you need cash urgently – this is known as a 'short-term benefit advance'. You will need to contact the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) office on 0845 604 3719 (62-66 Rushey Green, Catford SE6 4JD).

Check you've received all the government's cost-of-living payments

The government's <u>cost-of-living payments</u> are available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply, if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account.

If you think you're due a payment but haven't received one, <u>report a missing payment</u> to the government.

Be aware of scams! If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost-of-living payment, **do not talk to them or send a reply**. Check if your child is entitled to Free School Meals (FSM)

If your child is eligible for FSM you need to get them registered. This will allow them to get a free meal at school and, as a school, we'll get extra funding (known as the Pupil Premium) to support your child's learning.

Go to <u>this government website</u> to check if your child is eligible. If they are, or if you're not sure, please speak to a member of the school office team who will be able to help you register your child as entitled to FSM.

See what other support you can get from your local authority

Local authorities have many schemes that you might be eligible for, including:

- ➤ The Holiday Activities and Food Programme access to food and activities over the school holidays. Note that if your child is eligible for free school meals (see above), they'll also qualify for this free programme
- > Help with transport to school
- > Help with school uniform costs
- > Help with food and utility bills

Get free or low-cost food

If you're worried about not having enough food to feed your family, you're not alone. There are a number of places offering support.

- > St Mary's School has a **Breakfast Club** that starts at 07.30am and costs £4 per day. There is an **Enrichment Club** which runs after school until 5.45pm (£10 per day) and provides each child with a healthy snack. Speak to a member of the school office team if you would like to book a place for your child.
- If you have a child under 4, and meet the eligibility criteria, you may be entitled to healthy start food vouchers

- Find your local food bank: <u>Bankuet</u>, <u>The Independent Food Aid Network</u>, the <u>Trussell Trust</u>, or your local <u>community fridge</u>
- > Use food waste apps and websites like Olio (for free food and household items from your local community), Too Good To Go (for low-cost food from local restaurants), or Low Price Foods (food that has passed its best-before date, but is still safe to eat)
- > Become a member of a community shop. These organisations sell food to their members at a reduced price. Some shops are free to join if you meet certain criteria, and others ask for a small contribution. Find out if there's one near you by checking these websites: Community Community Commu

Free hygiene products

- > St Mary's offers free period products to any child that requires them during school hours.

 These are kept in classrooms and in the main school office.
- > Food banks may offer free toiletries and sanitary products. Check with your local food bank to see what's available.

Replace or repair household items at a low cost or for free

Check if you can get broken household goods replaced or repaired by your local community.

- > Get free household goods on Freecycle
- > Get help with DIY repairs at a Repair Cafe

Find a warm space to beat the chill

Some community spaces open their doors to provide a safe and warm space for a few hours. Many also offer hot drinks and WiFi. For example, Lewisham's libraries.
