Simon says: scratch your head like a monkey, roar like a lion, swing like a monkey etc. If the player starts the sentence by saying "Simon says..." the child must follow the instruction. If "Simon says..." is not used at the start of the sentence, the group shouldn't follow the instructions.</p>	<p>Can you sing some nursery rhymes together? Which ones are your favourite? You can stop from time to time and check if your child can finish the rhyme. "Humpty Dumpty sat on a. ?? "Baa, Baa, black sheep, have you any...?"</p>	<p>What's your favourite number? Draw some pictures of things that have made you feel happy.</p> 	<p>Try and make a healthy fruit salad today. Ask your child to help you to peel and chop the fruits. Keep it fun and keep each session short – maybe half an hour. The most important thing you can do is to carry on speaking with your child, to support their language development and to listen to their concerns at this time.
