MUSIC IN THE CURRICULUM


Brass Band

Lewisham Hospital

Reception class theatre and music project

Reception have been lucky enough to have the Iroko Theatre Company visit them for six weekly sessions. These highly interactive sessions included learning to construct a story with accompanying music, actions and movements. Every session included drumming lessons, where children had to remember instructions to know when and what to play. At the end of the project, the children enjoyed performing to parents and friends of the school.
