


Nursery are Going on a Bear Hunt!

The learning has been focused around the story book 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. Nursery class have been learning to re-tell the story using their story maps. They thought about what they would need to pack in their bags if they were going to go on a bear hunt, they made binoculars to look for bears and they explored swishy-swashy grass in the sensory tray. They even found some bear tracks in the garden!

Year 2 learn about China

Year 2 went to the Victoria and Albert Museum as part of their history learning. Like real historians, they used statues, clothes, books, furniture and paintings to find out what China was like in the past.

Year 2 also enjoyed a morning of cookery linked to their topic of China. They created delicious salads including some traditional Chinese ingredients, as well as some other flavours from around the world.

Fossils, Volcanoes and Earthquakes at the Natural History Museum

Year 4 went to meet a character called Mary Anning who was a female scientist. She was an English fossil collector who became famous for her discovery of an ancient reptile called an ichthyosaur (which means 'fish lizard'). The children had a go at comparing modern day skeleton bones to a fossil and worked together to determine which type of creature it had similarities to. The children also went to visit the Red Zone Gallery to find out more about natural hazards. They looked at a map of the world and noticed that volcanoes and earthquakes occur along the plate boundaries - fault lines. They even experienced how it feels when the Earth starts to shake!



Year 5 explore Victorian Britain

Year 5 have been exploring how to use charcoal to create different effects. Linking to their topic of Victorian Britain, they have designed these skylines of Smoky Cities. They also enjoyed a step back in time when they visited a Victorian School for the day.





Chinese New Year

St. Mary's celebrated the Chinese New Year in style! The whole school was a sea of red as everyone wore a red piece of clothing - raising money for charity at the same time.

To start the day the parents had a magnificent shared breakfast in the Community Hub. A huge thank you to our Chinese families who made such delicious plates of food to share with us all including peanut fritters and mung bean biscuits. Then the parents helped with Chinese calligraphy in some of the classes.




Poetry Competition 2020

SAFEGUARDING

Please ensure that all of your details and the children's medical details are updated on our school system. Please remember that the school gates open at 8:45 am and the children should come straight into class to read. It's really important that they arrive promptly every day so that they can maximise their learning. Please ensure that your child is collected on time, at the end of the school day at 3:15pm or at the end of their club at 4:15pm. PLEASE NOTE THAT IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT COLLECTED BY 3:30, THE SCHOOL CHARGE £5 FOR EVERY 15 MINUTES IN ORDER TO COVER THE CHILDCARE COSTS.

E - Safety - please continue to be aware of what your child is doing on-line - this could be on a mobile, tablet, laptop or computer. Many popular games that young children play on-line, such as Roblox and Minecraft, involve internet chat with other players and can potentially be used by abusive adults pretending to be children. Social media apps such as WhatsApp and Instagram should never be used by children.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!

Did you know that just by registering for free school meals, you could raise an extra £1,320 in Pupil Premium funding for the school - this is vital funding which will go directly to supporting the children's learning through extra activities and trips out, additional teaching staff and after school activities. To be eligible you will need to be in receipt of certain benefits and school staff will be happy to help you apply. All successful applicants will receive a free school jumper or bag!
