Home Learning



Free School Meal Vouchers

Many of our families received an Asda food voucher from St Mary's because their children are eligible for a free school meal. The government have recently announced a 'term time' £15 food voucher scheme for all pupils who are entitled to a free school meal. We will send these out to eligible families at the beginning of the summer term. I am conscious that some families may not know whether they are entitled to free school meals so we are encouraging all of our families to apply by following this link: https://lewisham.gov.uk/myservices/education/student-pupil-support/free-school-meals-and-extra-support-for-your-child

In addition to the government term-time vouchers, I personally made the decision to provide additional support, recognising the challenge that many of our families face at this time. St Mary's school provided weekly £10 vouchers during the Easter holidays for each child who is entitled to a free school meal.
