## **Pancake Day!**

It will be Shrove Tuesday on the 16th of February. This is the day before Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent in the Christian calendar. Traditionally, as Lent is a time of reflection and giving things up, pancakes were cooked on the day before to use up some of the ingredients. Why not make your own pancakes at home this year, following this simple recipe. We would love to see some photos of your delicious treats!

# **Ingredients**

- 100g plain flour
- 2 large eggs
- 300ml milk
- 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil, plus a little extra for frying
- lemon wedges to serve (optional)
- caster sugar to serve (optional)





# **Method**

#### STEP 1

Put 100g plain flour, 2 large eggs, 300ml milk, 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil and a pinch of salt into a bowl or large jug, then whisk to a smooth batter.

#### STEP 2

Set aside for 30 mins to rest if you have time, or start cooking straight away.

#### STEP 3

Set a medium frying pan or crêpe pan over a medium heat and carefully wipe it with some oiled kitchen paper.

# STEP 4

When hot, cook your pancakes for 1 min on each side until golden, keeping them warm in a low oven as you go.

## STEP 5


Serve with lemon wedges and caster sugar, or your favourite filling. Once cold, you can layer the pancakes between baking parchment, then wrap in cling film and freeze for up to 2 months.
