We have many exciting plans for the year ahead and will continue to build on the successes of last year. St Mary's is one of only six schools in Lewisham this year to have achieved the bronze level school travel plan accreditation.

Our enriching and creative curriculum will continue to lie at the heart of what we do as we invest in initiatives to promote the highest quality of education and experiences. We have been given an exciting opportunity to participate in a pilot project led by the Mayor of London called 'Talk Matters'. This project provides the



opportunity for all staff at St Mary's to be trained to extend children's oracy and communication skills. We will share the impact of this project at the end of the school year. We are also proud to offer our children a wide variety of experiences to bring the curriculum to life.
