Christmas Carols were sung by the whole congregation and the choir also performed, before Mrs Graham shared her Headteacher's address.

We celebrated those children from Years 4, 5 and 6 with 100% attendance as they went on a very special Christmas Journey. Set in the beautiful gardens of Lambeth Palace (the home of the Archbishop of Canterbury), the children travelled around 5 different sites, meeting key characters from the Nativity Story, with time provided for them to reflect on the deeper meaning of the story. Each child was given a special artefact to represent each stage of their journey.



Black History Month

They learnt how to cook African and Caribbean recipes and play the Djembe Drums. The children were learning from an experienced and talented performer and every class made great progress. They also learned about West African culture and the importance of Drumming throughout the History of the region.





Borough Market

Our Year 4 class took part in an exciting project to learn all about the process of growing fresh food from seed, before selling the produce at the world famous Borough Market in London Bridge. All of the money raised was donated to the Felix Project, which delivers food directly to almost 1,000 charities, serving people in need.







Community Projects

Each year, every class choose a Community project to support. Projects can focus on a local, national or global community and the children plan actions to make a difference. In a special worship, each class shared their plans for this year.




Climate Network Meeting
