Punctuality

Thank you to the vast majority of parents who have been on time at the beginning (8:40) and end of the day (3:10). If you are late for school in the morning, you will need to sign in using the electronic screen in the school lobby. Late charges of £5 per 15 minutes apply for any child not collected by 3:30. Late charges for Enrichment Club apply from 5:45 and are £10 per 5 minutes.

All children are currently getting a free meal at school, but Free School Meals eligibility entitles them to food vouchers in the holidays, access to free Holiday Club provision and importantly, thousands of pounds of funding for the school which will go directly on supporting teaching and learning.

Attendance Expectations

What YOU must do:

- * Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.
- * Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.
- * If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- * Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.
- * If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- * Check your child's attendance every day.
- * Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- * Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- * If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

Medication

If you require your child to take any prescribed medication during the school day, please speak to the school office and complete the required form.

School Fund

Thank you to all the parents who have already paid this vital funding, which we rely on to maintain the school premises. Please pay via ParentPay - £30 for the year or £10 a term. Sibling discounts are available.

Free School Meal Vouchers

We have continued to provide food vouchers to cover the school holidays for all pupils who are entitled to a free school meal. Year Community Food Bank Project

Year 3 have been collecting food donations to support those most in need in our local communities. They have made posters and spoken to each class to advertise their project. The food donations have been taken to St Mary's Church who will ensure they are passed to local foodbanks.



Reception class visit Glebe elderly residents

The residents at Glebe elderly residents home were delighted to be visited by our Reception class, who kindly shared Easter cards and gifts with them. The children enjoyed talking about their school and what they had been learning about, as well as listening to the residents memories of their school days.



We joined with local schools and community groups to make our voices heard as we joined a campaign to demand better housing for Lewisham residents. Our community conversations highlight that this is a key issue for our families. Children, parents and staff joined the protest, which began with speeches and a rally at Rushey Green primary school. Mrs Graham gave an impassioned speech to the prospective mayoral candidates and asked for them to make pledges. We then marched to Lewisham Town Hall, where we handed in a letter from several Lewisham headteachers, supporting the campaign.



RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch

St Mary's were excited to take part in this annual survey, along with thousands of people across the country. Our team of enthusiastic ornithologists used their binoculars to carefully observe and count the number of bird species in our Forest School Garden. The data sent to the RSPB will help them to build up a picture of how our wildlife is faring. We also filled some new bird feeders and hung them around the garden to encourage more birds to visit and hopefully nest in the Spring time.



WORSHIP AT ST MARY'S

We gave thanks to our Mothers in this special worship. We were joined by Father Steve from St Mary's Church, who was assisted by our team of servers. Our servers delivered the Bible readings and led us in prayer. Children reflected on what makes their Mothers so special and how we can help them. Thanks to all of the mothers who joined us for worship and received some Spring daffodils as a gift.





Our Ramadan Worship focused on the Muslim period of prayer, reflection and fasting. We shared readings from the Bible and the Quran. Children shared their beliefs and practises as well as sharing the significance of this special time in the Islamic faith.

Reflective worship for Lent - all of the children developed their spirituality in a space of peace and reflection. A central display was created and children sat around this display, with our Year 6 helpers adding items as we listened to Bible readings and took time to reflect on their meaning. The Bible passages focused on the events of Holy Week. Bread and wine represented the last supper, alongside a bowl and water as we remembered how Jesus washed the disciples' feet. The garden of Gethsemane was created using plants and finally, candles were added to show that Jesus is the light of the world. A multi-sensory experience was created with incense, scented candles and Taize music.





The Big Battery Hunt 2024

Our Eco Council have been active in supporting an important recycling initiative and they wrote this letter which was sent to all parents and members of the school community:

We are writing to ask you do something extremely important. We need you to take part in the Big Battery Hunt and recycle your used batteries. Did you know that over 600 million batteries are thrown away each year? That means that over 20,000 tonnes of batteries end up in landfill sites where they take over a hundred years to decompose. This is outrageous! The chemicals in the batteries can pollute the soil and water, harming poor innocent animals and endangering our lives too. Do you really want that?

But it doesn't have to be this way! You can do your bit to help our planet by going on a Big Battery Hunt to find all of our used batteries and bringing them to our recycling point in the reception area. Anyone that brings in batteries to be recycled will receive a ticket for our Prize Draw and could win a prize!

Lewisham Swimming Gala


