Thanks to all of the mothers who joined us for worship and received some Spring daffodils as a gift.




Punctuality

Finally, the week was rounded off in style with our 'Dress Up Day', featuring an amazing selection of famous and historical figures that feature in non-fiction books - prize winners included Abraham Lincoln, the Queen, Cleopatra and Mary Seacole!




















Year 3 Boats

Well done to everyone who completed the home learning challenge to design and build a boat, using household materials. Year 3 enjoyed a lovely morning in the sunshine, testing out the boats to find out if they floated! The quality of the designs was excellent and the boats looked amazing. Several of the designs featured extra features such as propellers, sails and cabins.







Year 1 and Year 2 visit Greenwich Park

The children went to Greenwich Park for a workshop. They had a great time learning about plants and how they grow as part of their Science Topic. Year 1 and Year 2 also learned about food chains and the different types of trees in the park.

Year 6 Design and Make their own Shoes!

This half term, Year 6 are learning all about the Vikings. As part of their Design Technology learning, the children considered what Vikings wore in the past and what their shoes were made from. Each child was challenged to design and make their own Viking shoes using a J cloth, thread, a needle, a pair of scissors and a marker. The results were great as Year 6 used their knowledge of different stitches (running stitch and backstitch) to join pieces of cloth together and even sew on some buttons.

Year 2 and Year 6 Maths Problem Solving

Our focus this half-term was on solving problems by working backwards. Year 2 knew that there were

some animals in the zoo and that there were 20 legs in total. They found lots of different possible combinations of animals.



Year 5 Viking inspired printing

Year 5 found out about Urnes Viking Art and learned how to create a collagraph print. They used string, tissue paper and cardboard to create their own designs. It was a lot of fun!
