OUR VISION

To be a learning community that promotes the unique gifts, wellbeing and potential of every person. Our work is founded on the life and teaching of Jesus Christ, building on His message of equality, peace and justice, guided by His words 'As I have loved you, so you must love one another' (John 13:34).

RATIONALE

To provide clarity and transparency to pupils, parents and carers about what to expect during periods of full or partial school closure or pupil isolation relating to coronavirus (COVID-19). In the event of some or all of the children not being able to be in school for a given period of time, home learning will be provided.

THE REMOTE CURRICULUM: WHAT IS TAUGHT TO PUPILS AT HOME

A pupil's first day or two of being educated remotely might look different from our standard approach, while we take all necessary actions to prepare for a longer period of remote teaching. For example, pupils may be sent home with some activities to complete independently, such as worksheets, reading their book and writing a book review.

We teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school wherever possible and appropriate.

- Reading continues to follow the Read Write Inc. Phonics approach for our younger learners, with KS2 mainly
 continuing to use Destination Reader activities. The Phonics programme uses videos which are matched to
 each individual learner's current level within the Read Write Inc. programme.
- Maths is primarily taught using the White Rose Maths resources, utilising videos and linked activity sheets.
- Writing is mainly supported by Talk for Writing units of learning, which have been specifically designed to support Home Learning.
- Religious Education (RE) continues to be taught following the curriculum map and using Southwark Diocesan Board of Education plans and other resources.
- Computing and E-safety activities are set to help reinforce and develop age-appropriate ICT skills.
- Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) follows the curriculum map and incorporates resources from our Jigsaw scheme of work where appropriate.
- We continue to use our Thematic curriculum to plan for the majority of other subjects Science, History, Geography, Art and Design Technology.
- Planning is sequential, supporting curriculum coverage and progression in knowledge and skills.

However, we have needed to make some adaptations in some subjects. For example, there are fewer practical activities such as Science investigations and we are not able to offer the rich learning experiences outside of the classroom (e.g. trips and fieldwork). Physical Education (PE) activities are shared, including links to exercise and yoga videos, as well as ideas for activities to keep fit and healthy whilst at home.

STUDY TIME EACH DAY

We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly 3 hours a day, although this will be less for our youngest learners.

ACCESSING REMOTE EDUCATION

Online remote education can be accessed using the following platforms:

- Website the weekly Home Learning Packs are added to the Class Pages. The Home Learning packs include a timetable, links to online resources and websites and supporting resources such as information packs, presentations and worksheets. As far as possible, all work will be compatible with phones and iPads. There will be no need to print the work, but the children will be given an exercise book to write their answers in if we are able to get this to them before the closure.
- **Email** the Home Learning Packs are also sent to each parent on email, using the ParentPay platform.
- Website our class pages contain a wide range of rich additional learning resources accessible as weblinks.
 These cover many curriculum areas and have been carefully researched. In addition, there are sections for parents covering E-Safety and support with Mental Health, Wellbeing and Bereavement.
- Daily live video sessions via Zoom. There will be a daily video session for the whole class, led by the class teacher. During these calls, the teacher will talk about the learning for the day, discuss misconceptions from previous learning and read a story or share a whole class learning activity. In addition, each child will have a weekly small group Zoom video call with their class teacher. This small group meeting will be a chance to share how the learning is going, receive feedback and ask any questions about the learning. The links to these sessions will be shared with parents and will be at the same time every day for each class. Please see the timetable and the protocol for these sessions in the appendices.
- **Purple Mash** is used for Year 1, 2, 3 and 4, as well as our Reception and Nursery classes. Teachers can set **Tasks in all areas of the curriculum**, which the children complete and send back to the teacher.
- **Microsoft Teams** is used by Year 5 and Year 6. Teachers can teach the whole class using a live video link and there is a live chat option as well. **Tasks** are set by the teachers, which the children complete and return.
- IXL is used by Year 3, 4, 5 and 6. It provides children with a vast resource of practice questions in Maths and English, which they can work through independently. Teachers set children challenges that are appropriate to their current attainment, promoting curriculum coverage and progression in knowledge and skills.
- **Teach your monster to read** is used by Years 1, 2, 3, 4, Nursery and Reception, children have individual logins and they can access a range of phonics games, matched to their ability.
- Busy Things and Espresso have a wide range of curriculum resources for all classes to use.

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We take the following approaches to support those pupils to access remote education:

- We have loaned over 70 laptops to families that have requested one.
- If our families do not have access to online platforms, work can be submitted to the teacher by taking a photo and emailing it to the school, this work is published on the school website. Alternatively, paper home learning can be returned to the school, however this should be no more than once a week.
- Teachers ring each family at least once a fortnight to discuss home learning and answer questions, they are also available to respond to phone calls and emails.
- If there is no access to a device for remote education, we encourage our families to contact the school so that we can provide your child/ren with a paper pack.

APPROACHES TO REMOTE LEARNING

We use a combination of the following approaches to teach pupils remotely:

- Live teaching (online lessons).
- Recorded teaching (e.g. Phonics Read Write Inc. Videos, White Rose Maths Videos, Espresso Videos covering all subjects, video/audio recordings made by teachers).
- Printed paper packs produced by teachers when requested (e.g. workbooks, worksheets).
- Year 5 and 6 have CGP textbooks at home.

ENGAGEMENT AND PARENTAL SUPPORT

We recognise the challenges faced by parents and carers when supporting home education, especially whilst also working from home or caring for other young children. Please contact the school if you have any concerns or require support and advice.

We expect our parents and carers to:

- Agree to follow all of the expectations in the Remote Learning Home School Agreement (see appendices).
- Set a routine for their child/ren to follow as this will help them to complete their home learning.
- Include regular breaks within the routine.
- Provide their child with a quiet space to complete their home learning.
- Engage with the Home Learning Packs and the timetable; monitor that their child is accessing the appropriate tasks and resources.
- Monitor that their child is completing activities to a good standard.
- Ensure that their child attends all Live Video Lessons and follow the protocol for video calls (see appendices).

FEEDBACK AND ASSESSMENT

We will be able to check if children are accessing their work through Live Video Lessons and Small Groups, monitoring Purple Mash, Teams and IXL, regular phone calls and work submitted via email or on paper. Parents will be informed via a phone call if the school have concerns.

Feedback and Assessment will be provided through Live Video Lessons and Small Groups, Purple Mash, Teams, IXL and phone calls. Pupils will receive feedback at least once a week through the Small Group meeting as well as regular feedback through online platforms.

ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR PUPILS WITH PARTICULAR NEEDS

We recognise that some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home. We acknowledge the difficulties this may place on our families, and we will work with parents and carers to support those pupils in the following ways:

- Children with an EHCP will be offered a place in school as they are classed as Vulnerable.
- Class teachers will differentiate work and resources for SEND children relating to the outcomes/targets on their EHCP or SEND support plans.
- If your child has an EHCP, they will receive additional phone calls through the week from a member of staff.
- We will provide printed resources, such as workbooks and worksheets for pupils who do not have suitable online access.
- Parents of SEND pupils may continue to require our support at this time, the SENCO can be reached by contacting the school by phone or email.

REMOTE EDUCATION FOR YOUNGER LEARNERS

The Home Learning Packs reflect the fact that younger children will require additional parental support to engage in the activities planned. There is a focus on story and song, alongside practical activities that support children to learn through play.

SELF-ISOLATING PUPILS

Where individual pupils need to self-isolate, but the majority of their class remains in school, a paper home learning pack will now be provided. This pack will include learning across a range of curriculum subjects and will be kept regularly updated to include the topics being taught in class. The learning pack will be sent home with the child when they need to leave school, or will be posted/dropped off if needed. The class teacher will ring at least twice a week to check on wellbeing and progress with the Home Learning. Work can be submitted in the ways described above in order to receive feedback. Additional tasks will be set as required, including accessing online resources and activities where appropriate.

- Please ensure that an adult remains within earshot at all times.
- Please ensure that your child/ren and everyone else in the household are wearing appropriate clothing.
- Please ensure that there is nothing inappropriate that can be seen or heard in the background.
- Please ensure that your child/ren are on mute unless/until the staff member asks them to unmute.
- Private messages must not be sent in the chatroom.
- Group messages should only be sent if requested by the teacher.
- The staff member reserves the right to remove any child, or adult, from the call at any time.
- For safety reasons, please do not share these links with anybody else.
- Please remember that our normal school rules and expectations apply during Class Zoom meetings.
