Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to St Mary's, we hope that you and your family enjoyed a wonderful and peaceful Christmas break. The children have settled well back into the school routines and we are looking forward to our next term of learning together. Your support in ensuring that your child completes their Home Learning every week and reads every day with you will continue to help your child to make accelerated progress and reach their full potential.

Curriculum

We will continue our Maths and Literacy learning by building on the key skills that the children learned last term. Our topics this term will be 'Dragons' and 'Town and Country'. We will be delivering a lot of the learning in Science, History, Geography, Art and Design Technology through our topics, with links to the learning in Literacy and Maths. Below is an outline of what we will be covering in our curriculum.

English



In English, we will be reading 'Dadaji's paintbrush' by Rashmi Sirdeshpande which is about the special bond a little boy shares with his grandad and the memories that the latter leaves behind. Children will develop reading skills of prediction and inference. By the end of the term, the children will be expected to write their own version of the story using statements and commands and sequencing sentences to form short narratives. We will be launching our Poetry competition before half-term, so please begin to think about a Poem that your child could learn and perform (or they can write their own!).

Phonics and Reading



Phonics will be taught daily every morning and spellings to learn at home will be set on Purple Mash on a weekly basis. These will be tested each week. We will be reading daily as a class. **Please ensure that you hear your child read every day and update their Reading Record.**

Maths



This half term we will be focusing on Place Value (numbers to 20) and addition within 20. In the second half of the term we will be learning about subtraction within 20, place value (numbers to 50) and measurement. Children will continue learning how to read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (–) and equals (=) signs. By the end of the term, the children will be expected to apply their knowledge of these operations to solving addition and subtraction questions and word problems using concrete, pictorial and abstract methods.

RΕ



In RE, we will be learning about 'What is it like to live as a Jew?' and 'Why is Easter the most important festival for Christians?' Children will learn why people belong to religions and explain how similarities and differences within and between religions can make a difference to the lives of individuals and communities.

Topic



Our topic this term is 'Dragons'. We will be linking our Science and Geography lessons to China. In Science we will classify animals from the Chinese New Year Story and other animals using simple criteria. In Geography, we will be learning to locate familiar places on a map (London, school, home etc.). We will also be learning about the different continents and locate China on the world map. Throughout this term, we will also be looking out for seasonal changes that take place in Winter.

Values



We will be focusing on the whole school values of **Love** and **Forgiveness**. We will be exploring these values throughout this term and children will have the opportunity to learn how these values can be displayed, referring to examples from Bible stories and influential figures.

Computing



In Computing, we will learn how to drag and drop items on screen to create our own jigsaw puzzle. We will also be using ICT to teach other subjects within the curriculum. The children will learn how to log onto the school computers and use them safely by following our school rules.

Music



The children will be listening to, appraising and composing music using a scheme of work called 'Music Express', where we will be learning a song and performing it in many styles.



We will be following the Jigsaw scheme of work in our PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education). This term we will be learning about 'Healthy Me' and 'Dreams and Goals'.

Home Learning

Home Learning will be set on Friday and should be completed by Tuesday. In addition to the learning set, your children should be regularly practicing their times tables, spellings and reading every day. There is a clear expectation that every child fully completes their Home Learning every week and we will be keeping a record and contacting parents where this is not the case.

Reading

It is vital that your child reads to you every day. Please complete their reading journal and ensure that they bring it into school **daily**. Your child will be given books, which we will aim to change on a weekly basis. If you have any concerns or would like some support with this, then please contact the school.
