Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to St Mary's. Thank you so much for supporting the school at the beginning of term by following all of the Covid-19 guidance to ensure that the school is as safe as possible. The children have settled in well.

Key reminders

- Please do not bring your child to school if they are unwell.
- If you, your child or any member of your household has symptoms of coronavirus, stay at home and get a test.
- School starts at 8:45 and ends at 3:00. Please be on time when you drop-off and collect.
- Please use the spray-painted footprints on the pavement to socially distance. Please only line up on this side of the pavement so that members of the public can pass by on the other side.
- Please do not send your child to school with hand gel as we have dispensers throughout the school in addition to a hand washing station in each class.

Curriculum

We have carefully designed our curriculum, recognising that the children have, again, missed several months of schooling in the midst of a pandemic that has changed all of our daily lives. We will have a strong focus on PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) in order to give the children time and space to share their feelings. Staff have been trained in Growth Mindset which will help children in developing their self-confidence and their resilience to cope with challenges. As well as promoting the children's wellbeing, these skills will also support them as learners.

We will begin our Maths and Literacy learning with a focus on key skills, in order to assess where the children are in their learning so that we can build from this starting point. Our topics this term will be 'Let's Communicate'. We will be delivering a lot of the learning in Science, History, Geography, Art and Design Technology through our topics, with links to the learning in Literacy and Maths. Below is an outline of what we will be covering in our curriculum.

English	<p>In Literacy, we will be creating our own Cumulative Tale. We will be reading the story 'Nail Soup' and using a story map to retell the story with key actions. Our focus within this unit of work will be characterization and dialogue.</p> <p>We will have daily spelling lessons and spellings will be sent home on a weekly basis. These will be tested each week. Please ensure that you take the time to practice these at home with your child.</p>
Reading / Phonics	<p>We will be reading daily as a class and independently. We will be working on developing our comprehension skills and reading polysyllabic words. Phonics will be taught daily to some children.</p>
Maths	<p>In Maths, we will be focusing on Fractions where we will learn how to order, compare and add and subtract fractions with the same denominators.</p>

	<p>In the second half of this term, we will be learning all about money, time and shape. We will also be learning how to measure and compare different masses and volumes of objects and liquids.</p> <p>On occasion, your child may be given a piece of personalised learning in Maths. If this does happen, please encourage your child to complete it, as this may have been an area of difficulty for them during the week's learning.</p>
Topic	<p>Year 3 will learn about how we communicate using sound in a variety of ways. They will find out about some of the important sound-based communication inventions through history, and how they have changed our lives. They will use maps and atlases to locate key communication hubs and locations in the UK and around the world.</p>
RE	<p>This term, Year 3 will learn about Judaism and the different festivals Jewish people celebrate and compare them with our own values and beliefs.</p>
Science	<p>In Science, Year 3 we find out about the science of sound and vibration, and how different objects make different types of sounds. They will learn about pitch and volume and how they are affected by differences in sound vibrations.</p>
Values	<p>Our whole school values for this term are 'Responsibility' and 'Faith'. We will be exploring these values further in our daily worship sessions.</p>
Music	<p>We will continue to use the Charanga scheme of learning, whilst taking account of guidance on singing and the use of musical instruments.</p>

PE

Please note that the children must bring the correct PE kit (plain navy blue/black jogging bottoms, plain white t-shirt and plain black plimsolls/trainers) to every PE lesson. Our PE coach, Mr Tientcheu, will lead the children in a variety of games and sports. **PE lessons will be on Thursdays.**

Jewellery

We advise that the children do not wear **any** jewellery to school although plain stud earrings are acceptable. Please bear in mind that if your child is wearing earrings they need to be able to remove them themselves for PE lessons.

Clothing

Please make sure that all of your child's items of clothing are clearly labelled with their names. This applies to all items of school uniform, PE kit and coats.

Homework

Homework will be sent home on Friday and is due back in by Tuesday. In addition to the homework set, your children should be regularly practicing their times tables and spellings.

Reading

It is vital that your child reads to you every day. Please complete their reading record and ensure that they bring it into school **daily**. Your child will be given books, which we will aim to change on a weekly basis. If you have any concerns or would like some support with this, then please contact the school.

Trips and Visits

At present, we are not taking the children on any trips involving public transport. However, we recognise the value of giving children experiences that bring the curriculum learning to life. We have planned a treasure hunt experience to take place this term which will be delivered in school.
