Now go to Purple Mash and complete the 'Animal Similes' 2do.</p> <p>Maths Practise adding 10 to any number here. Today we will learn about Block Diagrams. Let's learn more here and complete the sheet 'Thursday Maths'.</p> <p>DT <i>Mr Scrivens has lots of seeds for planting around the school that need to be kept safe and dry. He has asked us to design a good packet for his seeds. The packet must stop the seeds from falling out and getting wet. Look at the seed packet for your cress – ask a grown up to help you to carefully take it apart and look at the unfolded net. Can you draw around it on a piece of paper? Which part is the front? Back? Side seams? Can you see a label on the front of the packet? What is on the back of it? What material is it made of? Why? How does the packet stop the seeds from falling out. Discuss the answers to all of these questions with your grown up. You may also want to look at some envelopes – they have a similar design. How do they make sure nothing falls out?</i> Fill in your cress diary.</p>	<p>Phonics Click here to watch today's phonics video. Now practise your red words.</p> <p>Reading. Read for 10 minutes.
